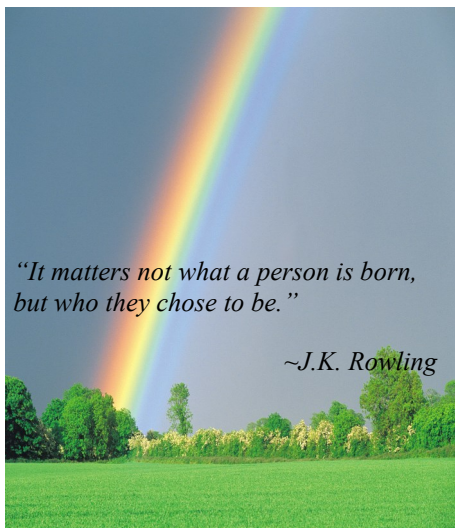


Individual Rights

Program Overview

Family Support Services is considered a financial gap service. We broker services individualized to meet your family's needs.

A Family Support Coordinator works with your family to develop an individualized Family Support Service Plan.

Family Supports financially assists with 26 different services. A few of the most common services include the following:

- Information and referral
- Assistance in identifying needs
- Respite
- Community/social activities
- Community living supports/ Individual community access
- Summer camps
- Special diets, clothing, and personal care
- Incontinence supplies

Eligibility

Individuals must have documentation of a intellectual and/or other developmental disability prior to the age of 22 or a Traumatic Brain Injury prior to age 18. They also must be three (3) years of age or older.

The individual must not be receiving a NOW or COMP Medicaid Waiver.

Eligible diagnoses include, but are not limited to:

- Developmental disability
- Intellectual disability
- Cerebral Palsy
- Autism Spectrum Disorders
- Down Syndrome
