## Women's Treatment & Recovery Support (WTRS)

WTRS is a highly structured, trauma responsive program that offers intensive services to pregnant and women with children who have substance use disorders.

We offer outpatient and residential treatment as well as accommodations for individuals in Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT). (Priority admission is given to pregnant females and IV users).

Here, individuals are empowered to maintain their recovery, resolve legal obligations, obtain/maintain employment, consistently meet familial responsibilities, and identify safe, affordable housing. As a reunification program, we work with the Department of Family & Children Services (DFCS) and the courts to safely transition children back into the care of their mothers, as appropriate.

WTRS provides an empathetic therapeutic environment focused on education of addictive disease, coping skills, relapse prevention, co-occurring disorders, trauma recovery, parenting skills, reunification with children, self-help skills, social skills, vocational rehabilitation, educational needs, and supportive employment.

## Therapeutic Childcare (TCC)

TCC provides services to the children of substance abusing women who are in residential treatment. This nurturing environment for children ages birth through five years, offers healing atmosphere for children to cope with traumatic issues that may surface.



TCC also provides an after-school program for children between the ages of 5-13. Children learn life skills as well as tobacco, alcohol, and drug prevention strategies. TCC empowers women by offering guidance to enhance parenting skills.

## Job Readiness

Part of recovery includes economic and personal self-sufficiency. We teach strategies for resume development, interviewing, job searches, obtaining and maintaining employment, and conducting individual self assessments. We offer basic computer skills courses, customer-relations training, and conflict resolution training.
