

POLICY:

It is the policy of the Cobb County Community Services Board and the Douglas County Community Services Board that clients are asked to perform duties that are voluntary and are a part of the individualized treatment to further therapeutic goals related to: learning proper procedures to increase independent living; improving concentration and task completion; and improving self-esteem related to accomplishments and contributions to the group.

PROCEDURE:

1. All clients are expected to care for personal living areas in accordance with their ability. Staff will provide supervision, training and coaching as needed.
2. Common areas (kitchens, bathrooms, living rooms, dining rooms, etc.) and community chores (cooking, washing dishes, etc.) are assigned to clients with staff supervision. A client may refuse to participate in any/all communal chores. Refusal will not be considered grounds for denial of services.
3. Client compliance or deficiencies in assigned tasks may be addressed in the plan of care and related to privilege levels.
